The above part time (0. 2 wte) post is available immediately on a fixed term contract until 30th November 2013.

Main purpose of the job:

You will have responsibility for the design, development and production of teaching and learning material and deliver either across a range of modules or within a subject area. You will work with the Academic and Programme Leads to ensure the efficient and effective delivery of teaching programmes in accord with the accreditation standards associated with the CBT/Parenting Supervisor curricula and College's education strategy and implementing the External Affairs strategy. You will also contribute directly to foundation teaching in one or more of the disciplinary areas in the College and to the development and implementation of innovative teaching practices across the College.

Specific Purpose of the job:

The job purpose is delivery of supervision and tutorials of either Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) or Parent Training (PT) for trainees undertaking the CYP IAPT Programme using standard approaches to supervision and teaching. The postholder will also be expected to run weekly clinical skills tutorials as part of the IAPT training programme and act as personal tutor to a small group of trainees. The therapist(s) will work using standard approaches to supervision .Training and regular supervision in the approach will be provided. For supervisors/tutors who have not already attended the IAPT six-day supervisor training this can be provided during employment.

Main duties and accountabilities:

- The post holder will act as an independent practitioner, supervising the formulating and implementation of appropriate treatment plans of either CBT or parent approaches for trainees undertaking CYP IAPT.
- They will provide weekly skills-based tutorials to CYP CBT or parenting trainees, supported by the CYP CBT or Parenting Lead where appropriate.
- The post holder will provide 1:1 termly individual tutorials to help track the progress of trainees in their stream.
- The post holder will work alongside clinical researchers, academic researchers, trainers and clinicians to provide a high quality supervisory service.
- The post holder will also be expected to undertake marking of academic work and assess clinical competency of trainees with a range of approaches.

- The post holder will also be required to keep records of supervision sessions and reflectively discuss clinical cases with the supervisory team.
- The post holder will implement policies and propose changes to practices, procedures for their own area of work and propose policy or service changes which impact beyond their own area for the wider training and clinic settings.
- The post holder will offer weekly group clinical supervision and supervise the work of CYP IAPT trainees.

This job description summarises the main duties and accountabilities of the post and is not comprehensive: the post-holder may be required to undertake other duties of similar level and responsibility.
