We are looking for an experienced, dedicated, and innovative Italian language tutor with the ability to teach at all levels of our degree programme.

The Department of Modern Languages at Exeter is one of the UK's leading and most respected centres for research and teaching in French, German, Hispanic Studies (including Catalan and Portuguese), Italian, and Russian. We produce research of international and world-leading standard, and have high rates of student satisfaction in the National Student Survey. Staff in the five languages work together on all areas of policy and delivery including admissions, curriculum development, assessment and student support. We have over thirty research-active members of staff, and a total research and teaching staff, including lecturers and Graduate Teaching Assistants, of 74. We are based on the Streatham Campus in Queen's Building, which has recently benefited from a £3 million investment in academic facilities. Modern Languages at Exeter has undergone a process of strategic review over the last few years, and is now looking to expand its undergraduate and staffing provision to meet increasing demand. Languages form a key part of the College of Humanities and University strategy.

Italian Studies

Every year 50 UG students enter our first year to study Italian either at beginners level or at post-A level. Italian Studies provides high quality teaching within a friendly, supportive and challenging atmosphere. Italian Studies offers students a wide ranging programme of studies including Postwar Italian cinema, Italian linguistics, and literature (in particular medieval poetry, Dante and Cavalcanti, Manzoni and the Manzonian tradition, fantastic fiction, modern and contemporary narrative).

Job description

Main purpose of the job

The successful candidate will have responsibility for teaching up to 17 language hours per week that form part of specialist undergraduate language degree programmes at all levels (from first-year beginners to final year degree level). S/he will work with colleagues to ensure the efficient and effective delivery of teaching programmes in accord with the College's education strategy. S/he will also contribute directly to the development and implementation of innovative teaching practices across the College.

Main duties and accountabilities:

- Teach as a member of a team within an established undergraduate language degree programme.
- Record-keeping, assessment and feedback duties as part of the teaching team: maintaining and returning accurate registers of student attendance, advising administrative staff of any significant student absence, and advising the Programme Director of any students who are not progressing as expected.
- Develop own teaching materials, methods and approaches.
- Supervise the work of students, provide advice on study skills and help them with learning problems.
- Respond to student questions, needs and feedback, provide weekly office hours, and offer support and advice as appropriate.
- Set and mark assignments and set examination questions as well as assessing the work and progress of students by reference to defined criteria and provide constructive feedback to students.
- Seek ways of improving performance by reflecting on teaching design and delivery and obtaining and analysing feedback.
- Attendance at Departmental meetings.
- Engage in continuous professional/staff development and training.

Liaison and Networking

The post holder will build internal contacts and participate in internal networks for the exchange of information.

Managing people

Manage own teaching, scholarly and administrative activities.

Initiative, problem-solving and decision-making

- Deal with problems which may affect the delivery of own teaching and contribute to decisions affecting the work of the team.
- Develop initiative, creativity and judgement in applying appropriate approaches to teaching and learning support and scholarly activities.
- Share responsibility in deciding how to deliver modules and assess students.
- Contribute to collaborative decision making with colleagues on academic content, and on the assessment of students' work.

Planning and managing resources

- Plan own day-to-day activity within the framework of the agreed programme.
- Co-ordinate own work with that of others to avoid conflict or duplication of effort.
- Contribute to the planning of teaching programmes.
- Use teaching resources and facilities as appropriate.
- Plan and manage own teaching and tutorials.
